### Standard Membership Classes

Member	
Eligibility:	A person who has completed an undergraduate or postgraduate degree approved under the EHA Course Accreditation policy. A person who has completed undergraduate or post graduate qualifications/majors in environmental or health related field. Any person having membership of EHA or AIEH (Australian Institute of Environmental Health) in the class of Associate Member or Member as at 31 December 1993.

Conditions	Must provide proof of completed studies with their application for membership.

Associate Member	
Eligibility:	A person with a qualification other than those qualifications providing eligibility for Member Class. (This includes a person who possesses a VET qualification at the level of Certificate IV or above in environmental or health related areas).
Voting Rights:	1 vote
Benefits & Entitlements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Newsletters, Website Access, Journal of Environmental Health</li> <li>• Attendance at all conferences and workshops at member rates</li> <li>• Ability to fill any office bearer positions</li> <li>• Participation at networks, committees, seminar/conference organisation &amp; special interest groups</li> <li>• May use the post nominal AEHA</li> <li>• Access to CPD and CEHT or CEHP programs</li> </ul>
Conditions	Must provide proof of completed studies with their application for membership.

Graduate Member	
Eligibility:	Has completed a qualification as defined within the eligibility section of the Associate Member or Member class. Has completed the above qualification within the past 12 months.
Voting Rights:	1 vote
Benefits & Entitlements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Newsletters, Website Access, Journal of Environmental Health</li> <li>• Attendance at all conferences and workshops at member rates</li> <li>• Ability to fill any office bearer positions</li> <li>• Participation at networks, committees, seminar/conference organisation &amp; special interest groups May use the post nominal MEHA</li> <li>• Access to CPD and CEHT or CEHP programs</li> <li>• Reduced membership fee (50%)</li> </ul>
Conditions	Access to this membership class is for a maximum of 2 consecutive years before advancement to Associate Member or Member.
Notes:	<i>The intention of this class is to provide a less expensive form of membership for recent graduates who are generally commencing employment in the environmental health field.</i>
Membership Fee:	<b>\$160 (early bird by 31<sup>st</sup> July \$147.50)</b>

<b>Student Member</b>	
Eligibility:	The conditions of entry to become a Student Member are that the applicant must be undertaking an undergraduate or postgraduate degree in an environmental or health related field.
Voting Rights:	NIL
Benefits & Entitlements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Newsletters, Website Access, Journal of Environmental Health</li> <li>• Attendance at all conferences and workshops at member rates</li> <li>• Ability to fill student office bearer positions</li> <li>• Participation at networks, committees, seminar/conference organisation &amp; special interest groups</li> <li>• Exposure to employment opportunities</li> </ul>
Conditions	May only access student member class once. Proof of student enrolment must be provided on application to this membership class.

### Sub-classes

<b>Temporary Inactive Member</b>	
Eligibility:	Has been a financial member for a minimum of 2 years within the class of an Associate Member, Member, Fellow and have temporarily ceased employment.
Voting Rights:	1 vote
Benefits & Entitlements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Newsletters, Website Access, Journal of Environmental Health</li> <li>• Participation at networks and special interest groups.</li> </ul>
Conditions	Minimum leave of absence period is 6 months. Maximum leave of absence period is 12 months. Request for access to the Temporary Inactive Member must be in writing. A maximum of 2 consecutive years as a Temporary Inactive Member may be approved.
Membership Fee:	<b>No Fee or Pro rata applied. Added to the Temporary Inactive List</b>

<b>Part – Time Member</b>	
Eligibility:	Has been a financial member for a minimum of 2 years within the class of an Associate Member, Member, Fellow and work only part-time.
Voting Rights:	1 vote
Benefits & Entitlements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Newsletters, Website Access, Journal of Environmental Health</li> <li>• Attendance at all conferences and workshops at member rates</li> <li>• Ability to fill any office bearer positions</li> <li>• Participation at networks, committees, seminar/conference organisation &amp; special interest groups</li> <li>• May use the post nominal associates with their normal class of membership</li> <li>• Access to CPD and CEHT or CEHP programs</li> <li>• Reduced membership fee (60%)</li> </ul>
Conditions	Must provide documentation from employer on part-time status – part-time is considered to be 0.6 FTE or less (ie 3 days a week or less).
Membership Fee:	<b>\$192 (early bird by 31<sup>st</sup> July \$177)</b>

<b>Retired Member</b>	
Eligibility:	Has been a financial member for a minimum of 10 years within the class of an Associate Member, Member, Fellow, Life Fellow or Honorary Fellow.
Voting Rights:	Nil
Benefits & Entitlements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Newsletters, Website Access, Journal of Environmental Health</li> <li>• Participation at networks and special interest groups</li> </ul>
Conditions	Must not be participating in related employment.
Membership Fee:	<b>No fee.</b>

<b>Corporate Member</b>	
Eligibility:	Corporate Membership will be divided into 3 sub-classes as described below: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Corporate 1 – Not for Profit Community based organisations</li> <li>• Corporate 2 – Not for Profit Government agencies (including Local Government)</li> <li>• Corporate 3 – Commercial businesses</li> </ul>
Voting Rights:	1 vote

Conditions	Votes may only be cast by the nominated person on the membership application. All corporate members must be able to demonstrate a contribution to environmental health policy or practice and undertakes to promote the objects of EHA.
